2023 toundertake Research, Conservation and Documentation of the Menhir site at Mudumalavi llage in the Krishna Mandal, Narayan pet district, Telangana.

Anarchaeologicalsite,locallyknownas *Niluralla Thimmappa*, isasignificantsite reflecting the culture, tradition and astronomical knowledge of the people living in this areas ome 3000 years ago. In archaeological parleys, the monuments are known as megaliths. Here, we have about 80 big menhirs (77.41121E16.378998N), which are a stallas 10-15 ft. and severalthousands of boulderstones which have dimsions of about 3-4 ftinwidth and breadth, arranged in different formations. Originally, the monuments were spread out in an area of about 80 acres. It is to be noted here that nowhere in India or probably in Asia we have so many menhirs and alignment stones concentrated at a place. Apart from these, we also have several megalithic stone circles at this place.

ThemenhirsandAlignment stones are arranged in rowswithseveralstones in eachline. These rows face different directions. Observations in the past indicated that, some of the serows align with the rising and setting Sun on the days of solar significance like thesummer and winter solstice..It appears that the ancient people at this place used the sealign ments to observe the season almovement of the Sun and formaking calendrical and the season almost entries of thecalculations to determine the changing seasons. Study of the cup-marks has revealed that, it is a depiction of Ursa Major constellation, which is also known as GreatBear constellation. The constellation is known as Saptarshi Mandala (Sapta=seven) in Indian Tradition. The significance of this constellation is that, any time in the nightinary season the top two stars of the seven stars known as 'Dubhe'and 'Merak'alwayspoint to north. An drawn through these stars point thenorthdirection. Atpresent the depiction of this constellation is the **earliest depiction of then** ightskyfromentiresouthAsia.

## FreshDiscoveryofConstellations

Intensive study by the Team of Researchers has resulted in the discovery of another elaboration of the discovery of the disratedepictionshowingseveralconstellations. This depiction is executed on a bedrock. In this ne wlydiscovereddepiction, wecannotice Ursa Majoras wellas Leo Constellations.It also interesting that, they have even depicted the 'North Star' orthe'PoleStar'.ThisfactsuggeststhattheMegalithiccommunitycoulddefinitelydeterminethe orientations and they could identify the North Star.

The Archaeo astronomical significance of the site has been brought to the notice of the International community by Shri Prof. Er. Manikonda Vedakumar, Chairman, Deccan Heritage Academy Trust when he attended recently the ICOMOS conference at Sydneyin Australia. It is hoped that all these efforts will help in obtaining World Heritage tag for the site.

Theresearchonthesiteisbeingtakenactivelybytheresearchteam. Photogrammetric Surveyofthesitean didentification of more alignments among the boulderst one sis in progress. An iron barricade has been erected around the stone containing the Ursa Major depiction. Boards informing the significance of the site are erected on the site. Signages along the road leading to the site are put up to help the tour ists reach the site easily from the Highway at Gudebellore village on the Mahbubnagar-Raichur road.

Considering the uniqueness of the site and the potential to develop as a majorTourist centre, that can help in boosting the economy of the region, it is appealed to thelocalpeopletotakeactivepartinpreservingthesemonuments without causing any damaged uring a gricultural operations.
